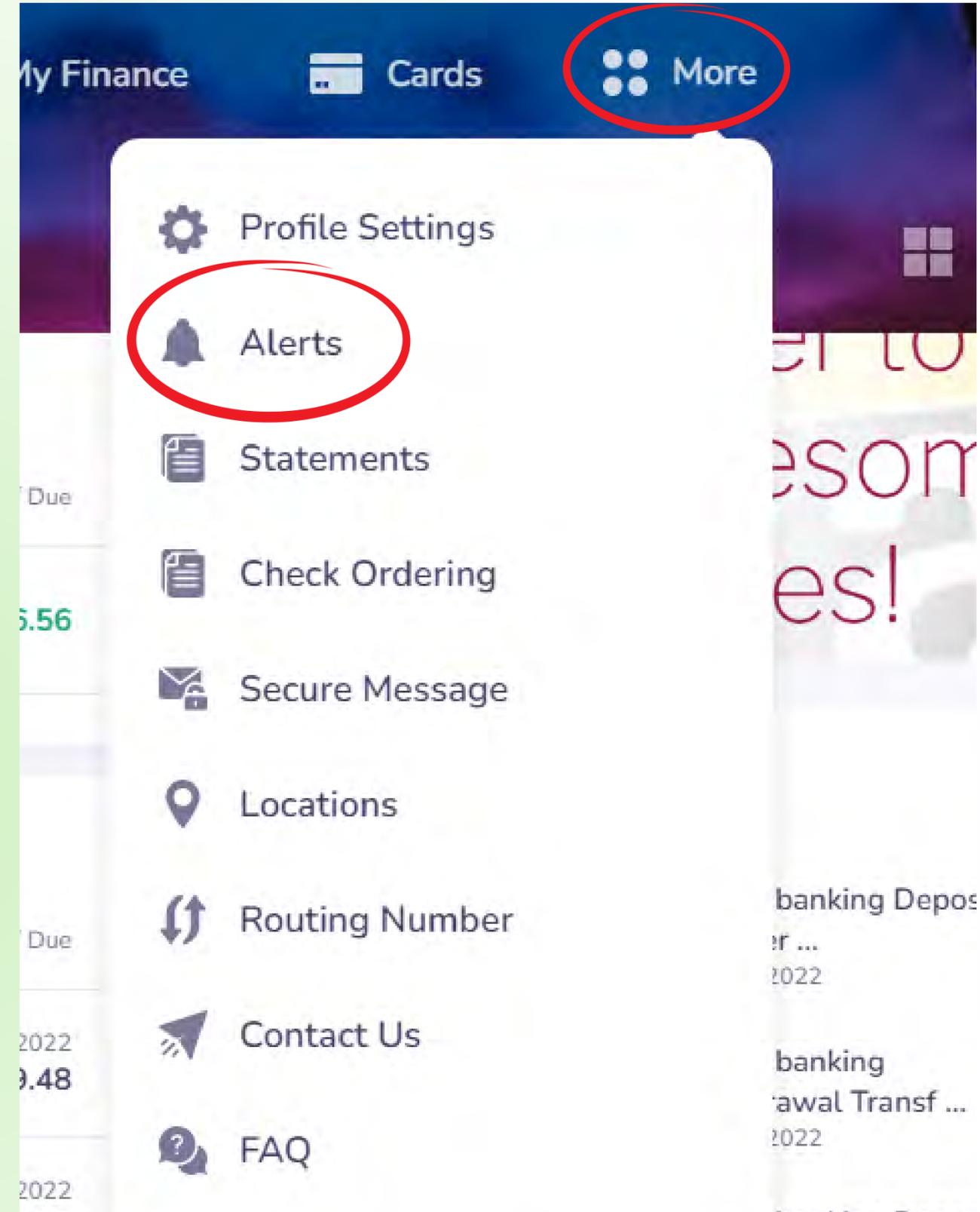

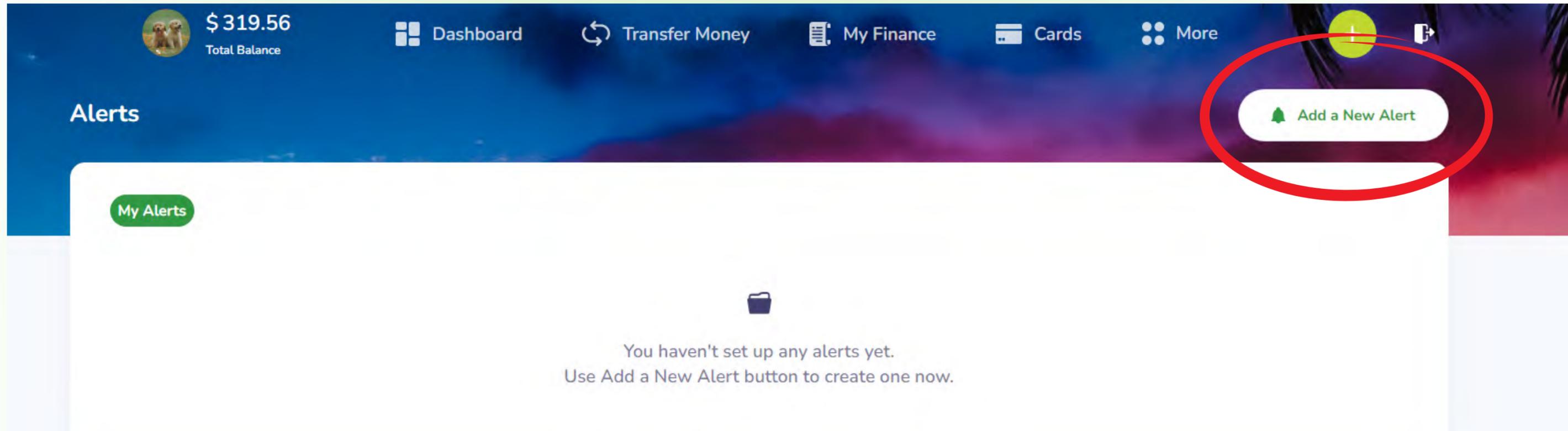
# Step 1:
